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A Life Connected: Jan Lang's Journey with UPMC Harrisburg by Teri Jakob

Jan Lang, the current president of the Pinnacle Health Auxiliary, has a deep and personal connection to UPMC Harrisburg that spans multiple decades. Her story is one of family, community, and a strong bond with the hospital she's helped support through her Auxiliary leadership.

Jan's journey with UPMC Harrisburg began in the hospital's cafeteria, where she worked during the summers as a college student, thanks to a conversation her mother had with the director of food services. "My mom mentioned I was looking for work, and the next thing I knew, I was hired," Jan recalls with a smile. "I worked there all summer and continued into the fall."



"Back then, the hospital was quite different—North 11 was the name of one wing, and the cafeteria was on the first floor, where the doctors' dining room is now. I even remember the tiny gift shop in the old main entrance—it was no bigger than a closet!"

Her connection to UPMC didn't stop there. Jan went on to work in the business office while finishing school, eventually moving into the accounting department, finishing her career as the Executive Assistant to the UPMC Pinnacle President. Jan is now enjoying retirement after a long and rewarding career.

Along the way, her sister and brother-in-law also found their places within the UPMC family. Her sister worked in registration in the emergency room while attending Penn State, and her brother-in-law handled payroll for the nursing staff. "It was a family affair," Jan chuckles. "Sometimes, when I worked in food service, I would have lunch with my brother-in-law in the basement coffee shop." The Auxiliary has always been a big part of Jan's life. She became a lifetime member in the 1980s. Jan's mother managed the mail room at UPMC Harrisburg, and Jan witnessed how the Auxiliary played a crucial role in supporting the hospital's mission. Jan became more involved after being encouraged to participate by her boss, Susan Edwards. She became acquainted with many members of the Auxiliary through her professional roles at the hospital, include Helen Tzanis and Joyce Acri. Joyce's husband worked with Jan's husband Hans.

"The Auxiliary started as a small group, running bake sales and handmade item stands," she explains. "That's how the coffee shop began—selling baked goods and handmade items donated by Auxiliary members."

Knitted Knockers are handmade soft, knitted breast prosthesis. They serve as an alternative to commercially available silicone models, which aren't always appropriate for every breast cancer patient. This event supports a community need because each breast cancer journey is so personal and





individual. The Pinnacle Health Auxiliary was honored to host this event during Breast Cancer Awareness Month to provide loving support and care woman to woman.

Jana Davis, an avid knitter and Auxilian, led the step-by-step instruction. Jana shared with us the background of the Knitted Knockers Support Foundation headquartered in Bellingham, Washington. Her enthusiasm for bringing this project to central Pennsylvania was contagious.

Shelly Matter, owner of Humble Stitch (a fiber arts store in Newport, PA), was instrumental in obtaining a yarn donation from Berroco Yarn Company. Knitted

Knockers need to be made with specific kinds of yarn that are comfortable to a patient's skin, durable, and washable, among other characteristics.

Bailey House: A Lifeline for Patients and Their Families by Teri Jakob

In June 2024, Michael, a Vietnam veteran, and his wife, Evelyn, arrived at Bailey House seeking comfort during a critical medical journey, thousands of miles from home. Thanks to a dedicated team of individuals and agencies, this couple found more than just accommodations—they found peace, security, and an unwavering support system during a difficult time.

PA Department of Military and Veterans Affairs initially led the efforts to bring Michael and Evelyn to Bailey House, working closely with UPMC's Veteran Care Services, led by Marc Migala, UPMC Social Worker, Jamie We never know when a health emergency may strike.

Michael and his wife, Evelyn, were on vacation out of the country when Michael's health suddenly deteriorated. Many organizations worked together to make arrangements for this family to come to the Bailey House while he underwent a long treatment journey.

Snyder, and Adrienne Beck, the Bailey House Coordinator. Together, they ensured that the couple had a safe and welcoming place to stay while Michael received treatment.



Arriving in early June, Michael and Evelyn immediately felt the impact of being close to the hospital, giving them one less thing to worry about during an overwhelming time. Michael reflected on how grateful they were for the swift action taken by the UPMC team, particularly in coordinating with the hospital and social workers to ensure they were not only housed but also supported throughout their medical journey. "Things just don't always fall into place like that," he shared, acknowledging how Bailey House became a lifeline for them when all other options fell through.

Michael also expressed his deep gratitude for Dr. Chip Renninger, whose exceptional care made an indelible impact on both him and Evelyn. "When Dr. Renninger came in, everything just fell into place," Michael said. "He saw what was needed and immediately took action. I was in so much pain, and the way he cared for me, it was as if he knew exactly what I needed before I even asked." Dr. Renninger's approach to Michael's care not only alleviated his physical pain but also reassured both Michael and Evelyn during an emotionally challenging time.

During their stay, Bailey House provided them with more than just shelter. Michael found

comfort in the connections he made with the staff and other guests. "The fellowship from all the guests together is amazing," he said. "Adrienne, Ari, and Jonah do such a beautiful job with everybody here. We are so blessed to be able to help one another."

His words reflect the true mission of Bailey House—creating not only a place of rest but a community where families can support one another during their most challenging days.

Their stay lasted into October, and Michael and Evelyn both expressed how much the warmth and hospitality they experienced at Bailey House helped them through the hardest moments. Now, having returned home to settle their affairs, they've made the decision to move permanently to this area. As a testament to the care and compassion they received, the couple have made giving back to Bailey House a family priority, already making their first donation to support the house that made such a difference in their lives. Bailey House provides adult family members who live outside the immediate Harrisburg area with a comfortable and convenient place to stay while their seriously ill loved one is hospitalized. A home away from home, the Bailey House is situated two blocks from UPMC Harrisburg at 119 & 121 Washington Street.
